

concerned. In such cases, a mark of “0” and a grade of DNW (did not write) will be indicated on the Term 1 Report Card. A student who misses writing a January exam for any reason, will be ineligible for the Honour Roll in Term 1. The student’s final course mark will be determined by the following formula: **30% first-term mark + 70% second-term mark**. Should a student miss a June examination, he will be required to write the supplemental examination in that subject; this examination will be counted in the same manner as a regular June examination.

Manitoba Education and Training mandates standards examinations in English and Mathematics at the Grade 12 level. These examinations comprise 30% of the student’s grade in the subject concerned.

Exemptions

Exemptions from writing June exams are an academic privilege and not a right. To be eligible a student must maintain an 80% average throughout the school year. Exemption recommendations are made by teachers on a course-by-course basis provided the student meets the following criteria in a particular course:

1. The student’s grade on the January Exam is 80% or better.
2. The student’s Term 1 grade is 80% or better.
3. The student maintains a grade of 80% or better in the second term.
4. The student is considered in good-standing in the course in terms of his behaviour and conduct.

Note: Grade 10 and 11 students must earn a 80% in Christian Service to be eligible for exemption from the Religion exam.

All exemption recommendations are subject to the Principal’s approval. Students will be given official notice of their exemption status in their courses on the last regular day of classes. Students who miss the January exams, even for valid reasons, are not eligible for exemption.

Exemptions may be removed for incomplete work, substandard assignments or for disciplinary reasons at the discretion of the Principal. In addition, a student whose second term mark in a course falls below 80% will not be eligible for an exemption in that course. An exempted student’s final grade will be determined in the usual way according to the formula established by the given academic department for the weighting of terms.

During review days in June, students with multiple exemptions have the choice to study on their own rather than attending review classes. To obtain this privilege, students in grades nine through eleven must obtain 4 exemptions in full credit courses. In grade twelve students must obtain exemptions in 3 full credit courses. Full credit courses do not include half courses such as Religion in grades eleven and twelve. In addition, the Grade 12 Career Development course is not included in determining whether a student is required to attend review classes.

Supplemental Exams

Supplemental exams are written after the final examinations. A student may register for only two Supplementals, must have had a final grade of at least 40%, and receive the Principal’s permission to write. Students who are incomplete in their course work before Review Classes forfeit their chance to write Supplemental Exams. This ruling also applies to Grade Twelve first term courses. In order to write supplemental exams, a student must have attended our remedial classes. The fee (\$10.00) for writing a supplemental is paid before the exam is taken. Books for study may be obtained from the school at the times indicated by the front office. Marks obtained will be sent home separately. The
